SUBJECT AND PREDICATE LESSON

COMPLETE SUBJECT:

- * who or what the sentence is about
- * person(s) or thing(s) that performs the action
- * contains describing words (usually adjectives) that identify the simple subject.
- * may be one or more persons or things
- * may be a pronoun
- * usually comes first in statements and exclamations
- * **may not** come first in questions-- Parts of the verb may surround the subject in questions.
- * Often the subject is not written in commands, but is understood to be “you”—the person spoken to.

Examples:

- a) **Susan** answered the door.
- b) **Sparky and Spot** raced across the lawn.
- c) **The World Trade Center and the Pentagon** were attacked on September 11, 2001.
- d) **Every family in the neighborhood** came to the barbecue.
- e) **The tall, slender lady with the red hair** answered our questions.
- f) **Who** wants to go fishing?
- g) Did **your mother** make your lunch? *(Make it a statement: **Your mother** did make your lunch.)
- h) How did **Andy and Teddy** build those robots?
- i) **The house on the corner** is on fire!
- j) (**You**) Open the window, please. (**You**) Look out!
- k) **She and I** went to the movies on Friday.
