ADVERBS LESSON

How, When, and Where Words

ADVERBS are words that modify (change) verbs, adjectives, or other adverbs. They tell time, place, and manner, or, in other words, they answer the questions **how, when, and where**. Adverbs that tell how **how** often end in "**ly**."

- Justine **quickly** finished her chores so she could play.
- Austin stacked the books **neatly** on the shelf.
- Nick **hardly** moved a muscle all morning.
