Every sentence must have a subject and a verb. The subject tells who or what the sentence is about. The verb tells what the subject does or is.

Sometimes verbs go together, and a STATE-OF-BEING verb helps an ACTION verb complete its meaning. The helping verbs are: is, am, are, was, were, be, been, being, can, could, shall, should, will, would, may, might, must, do, does, did, have, has, had.
